



Clinical Academic Funding Policy

1. Purpose

Clinical Academics make a significant contribution to teaching and training doctors, conducting research, and providing clinical services which is vital in maintaining the high standard of health care provided to the community.

A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the WA health system and the University of WA (UWA) was developed in 2015 to formalise recruitment and appointment arrangements for Clinical Academics.

The purpose of the Clinical Academic Funding Policy (the policy) is to specify the funding of Clinical Academic appointments provisions that apply to Health Service Providers.

This policy is a mandatory requirement for Health Service Providers under the *Employment Policy Framework* pursuant to section 26(2)(f) of the *Health Services Act 2016*.

2. Applicability

This policy is applicable to the following Health Service Providers that employ Clinical Academics concurrently with UWA:

- Child and Adolescent Health Service
- East Metropolitan Health Service
- North Metropolitan Health Service
- South Metropolitan Health Service
- PathWest Laboratory Medicine WA.

3. Policy Requirements

Health Service Providers are required to negotiate funding arrangements with UWA for each Clinical Academic in accordance with this policy to ensure a sustainable Clinical Academic workforce for the future.

Funding arrangements must be consistent with the MOU and the University of Western Australia and Minister for Health, Clinical Academics Superannuation Administration Deed, 21 October 2003, and specify:

- the commencement of contract renewal negotiations be no less than 12 months prior to expiry of the funding arrangement
- the default position for the proportion of funds contributed by the Health Service Provider and UWA, prior to the commencement or renewal of a contract is:

- Health Service Providers fund the hospital component of a Clinical Academic appointment
 - UWA funds the university component of a Clinical Academic appointment.
- Note: Health Service Provider Chief Executives retain discretion to fund a portion or the entirety of the UWA component.
- the salary to be paid by the Health Service Provider and the salary to be paid by UWA
 - any other items to be funded (e.g. oncosts and relocation expenses where agreed).

Health Service Providers must use the UWA Funding Arrangements for Clinical Academic Position Form to document all funding arrangements with UWA.

Health Service Providers must undertake all administration processes required to give effect to a funding arrangement and contract of employment issued in accordance with the Industrial Agreement and MOU.

Consistent with applicable record keeping obligations, Health Service Providers will obtain and maintain the following contemporary records:

- the employment contract entered into by the Health Service Provider and, where possible, UWA
- the endorsed funding arrangement.

4. Compliance Monitoring

The System Manager may conduct audits on a periodic basis to monitor and evaluate Health Service Provider compliance with this policy.

The System Manager may also request additional information including a copy of the funding arrangement and a copy of the employment contract, on an as needs basis.

7. Definitions

The following definition(s) are relevant to this policy.

Term	Definition
Clinical Academic	Clinical Academic is defined in the Industrial Agreement, or its replacement, to mean a medical practitioner employed by the University of Western Australia (UWA) as a professor, associate professor, senior lecturer or lecturer and also employed by a Health Service Provider as a medical practitioner undertaking clinical service work.
Memorandum of Understanding	A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the WA health system and UWA signed 23 December 2015, applies to all Clinical Academic appointments and includes a provision relating to funding arrangements.
Health Service Provider	Means a Health Service Provider established by an order made under section 32(1)(b) of the <i>Health Services Act 2016</i> .
Industrial Agreement	Means the WA Health System - Medical Practitioners (Clinical Academics) AMA Industrial Agreement 2022 or its replacement.
System Manager	The term used for the Department of Health (Department) CEO to reflect their role as being responsible for managing the WA health system to the extent necessary to provide stewardship, strategic leadership and direction and to allocate resources for the provision of public health services in the State (see section 19 of the <i>Health Services Act 2016</i>).
WA health system	The WA health system is comprised of: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) the Department; (ii) Health Service Providers; and (iii) contracted health entities, to the extent they provide health services to the State.
