# Staff Member Influenza Vaccination Program Policy

### 1. Purpose

The purpose of the *Staff Member Influenza Vaccination Program Policy* (the policy) is to reduce the risk of staff members from acquiring and transmitting influenza, a notifiable infectious disease. This policy mandates the requirements for the WA health system and their staff members with regard to the annual influenza vaccination.

Influenza is a highly transmissible acute respiratory infection, and can cause severe illness or death, especially in people at high risk. Vaccination is the only way to specifically protect oneself against influenza and its complications.

This policy supports recommendations within the following guidelines documents:

- Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation, <u>Australian Immunisation</u> Handbook
- National Health and Medical Research Council in collaboration with the Australian Commission on Safety and Quality in Health Care, <u>Australian Guidelines for the</u> Prevention and Control of Infection in Healthcare 2019.

This policy aligns with the following legislation:

- Public Health Act 2016
- Work Health and Safety Act 2020.

This policy is a mandatory requirement for Health Service Providers under the *Public Health Policy Framework* pursuant to section 26(2)(c) of the *Health Services Act 2016*.

This policy is also a mandatory requirement for the Department of Health pursuant to section 29 of the *Public Sector Management Act 1994*.

# 2. Applicability

This policy is applicable to WA health entities.

The requirements contained within this policy are applicable to the services purchased from contracted health entities where it is explicitly stated in the contract between the contracted health entity and the State of Western Australia or Health Service Provider. The State of Western Australia or Health Service Provider contract manager is responsible for ensuring that any obligation to comply with this policy by the contracted health entity is accurately reflected in the relevant contract and managed accordingly.

## 3. Policy Requirements

WA health entities must plan and implement an influenza vaccination program across their service each year which aims to increase influenza vaccination uptake by staff members. Influenza vaccination programs must:

- provide no cost for influenza vaccinations to all staff members
- promote influenza vaccination to staff members
- promote the mandatory requirement for staff members to complete the staff member vaccine consent form
- facilitate staff member completion of the staff member vaccine consent form
- monitor staff member compliance to complete the staff member vaccine consent form
- provide access to staff influenza vaccination clinics where staff can complete the staff member vaccine consent form and receive an influenza vaccine
- facilitate and ensure the staff member vaccination is recorded.

Staff members of the WA health system must complete the staff member vaccine consent form (available via HealthPoint) by 30 June each year, to either:

- · consent to the influenza vaccination
- decline the influenza vaccination, or
- state that they have already received the influenza vaccination elsewhere in that calendar year.

## 4. Compliance Monitoring

The Communicable Disease Control Directorate, on behalf of the System Manager is responsible for monitoring and reporting WA health entities compliance to the Health Executive Committee on the following:

- staff member compliance of staff member vaccine consent form completion by WA health entity and occupational group
- staff member influenza vaccination coverage by WA health entity and occupational group.

Following reporting to the Health Executive Committee, the Communicable Disease Control Directorate will publish the data on the Department of Health website by the end of the calendar year.

The System Manager may also request additional information on the influenza vaccination programs to ensure alignment with policy requirements.

Influenza	Under the <i>Public Health Regulations 2017</i> , influenza is a notifiable infectious disease.		
Notifiable infectious disease	An infectious disease that, when diagnosed, requires health providers to report to the WA Department of Health, under the <i>Public Health Act 2016</i> section 90 and the <i>Public Health Regulations 2017</i> .		
Staff member	Pursuant to section 6 of the Health Services Act 2016, a staff member of a Health Service Provider means  • an employee in the health service provider  • a person engaged under a contract for services by Health Service Provider.  An Employee pursuant to section 3(1) of the Public Sector Management Act 1994 is a person employed in the Public Sector by or under an employing authority, which, for the purposes of this policy is the Department of Health.

WA health system	The WA health system is comprised of:  (i) the Department;  (ii) Health Service Providers (North Metropolitan Health Service, South Metropolitan Health Service, Child and Adolescent Health Service, WA Country Health Service, East Metropolitan Health Service, PathWest Laboratory Medicine WA, Quadriplegic Centre and Health Support Services); and  (iii) contracted health entities, to the extent they provide health services to the State.
